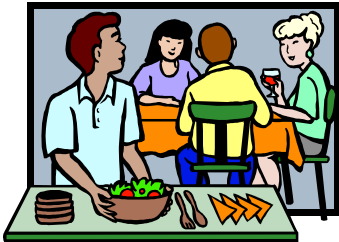

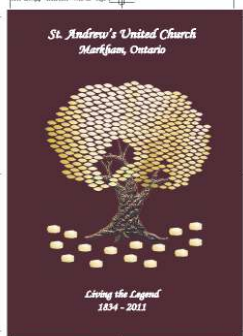
### Parenting Your Parents

## ADVENT 2010



Advent at St. Andrew's this past season was highlighted by several wonderful occasions.

On Jan. 5<sup>th</sup>, pet lovers and other congregants were warmed by the blessings bestowed on our furry (and some not so furry) friends.

On the morning of Sunday, December 12, the "Angels" returned to the church with their purchases for those less fortunate. The mitten tree was laden with scarves, hats and of course, mittens.

Later that day, an evening of Carol Singing with the Queen's Own Rifles Concert Band took place in the Sanctuary, decorated warmly with Christmas lights.

Sunday, the 19<sup>th</sup> was the fourth Sunday in Advent. Special music and readings helped lead us out to the Christmas eve service.

Throughout the advent celebrations, Rev. Niles' messages from the pulpit delivered a meaningful thread to the season.

A warm and sincere thank you to all the folks who put so much of their time and talents into our celebrations.



## LITURGICAL COLOURS

The liturgical colours are the colourful banners that hang from the pulpit and the lectern every Sunday. You may notice that the colours change periodically and for very good reasons.

The rationale behind liturgical colours is to give a visual expression to the celebration of the Christian faith and a sense of progression through the Christian life. The United Church does not prescribe a particular set of colours for vestments and church decorations. Schemes for the use of colour should be regarded as suggestions and not absolute rules and they may vary from church to church. Here is the progression followed at St. Andrew's:



**EPIPHANY:** The current colour in the Sanctuary is **green**. This denotes Epiphany, marking the final day of the Christmas season and is used until Lent .

**LENT:** The **purple** colour of Lent represents a season when we turn inward and reflect on how we might re-orient our lives towards God.

**HOLY WEEK: Purple** represents the blood of the innocent Christ as he suffers on the cross and is also used from Palm Sunday to Easter Eve.

**EASTER:** For the Easter season, Easter Sunday, April 24, 2011, until Pentecost, (June 12,2011), the colours **white and yellow** remind us that the tomb is empty and Jesus is alive.

**PENTECOST:** This Sunday is symbolized by the colour **red** to reflect the fire and energy of the Holy Spirit.

**PENTACOST TO ADVENT: Green**, the colour of growth and life represents the invitation to grow in our faith and is used to the first day of advent.

**ADVENT:** is the time of anticipation and waiting for the birth of Jesus and **blue** is chosen as the symbol of hope.

**CHRISTMAS DAY** The colours **yellow or white** are used to mark Christmas to Epiphany. They represent the invitation to follow Christ's light in our own lives.



## PENNIES AND KITS

Once again the youth at St. Andrew's are collecting your **pennies**. These pennies will turn into **Kits for Kids**. Presently, the children report 13,150 pennies collected. You do the math! We need a lot more to make this a successful project. So empty out your pockets, purses and piggy-banks and support the Sunday School children.



'Kits for Kids' is an initiative started by John and Liane Niles in 1992. It is a program that provides a package of personal products and toys for children being admitted to emergency foster care. 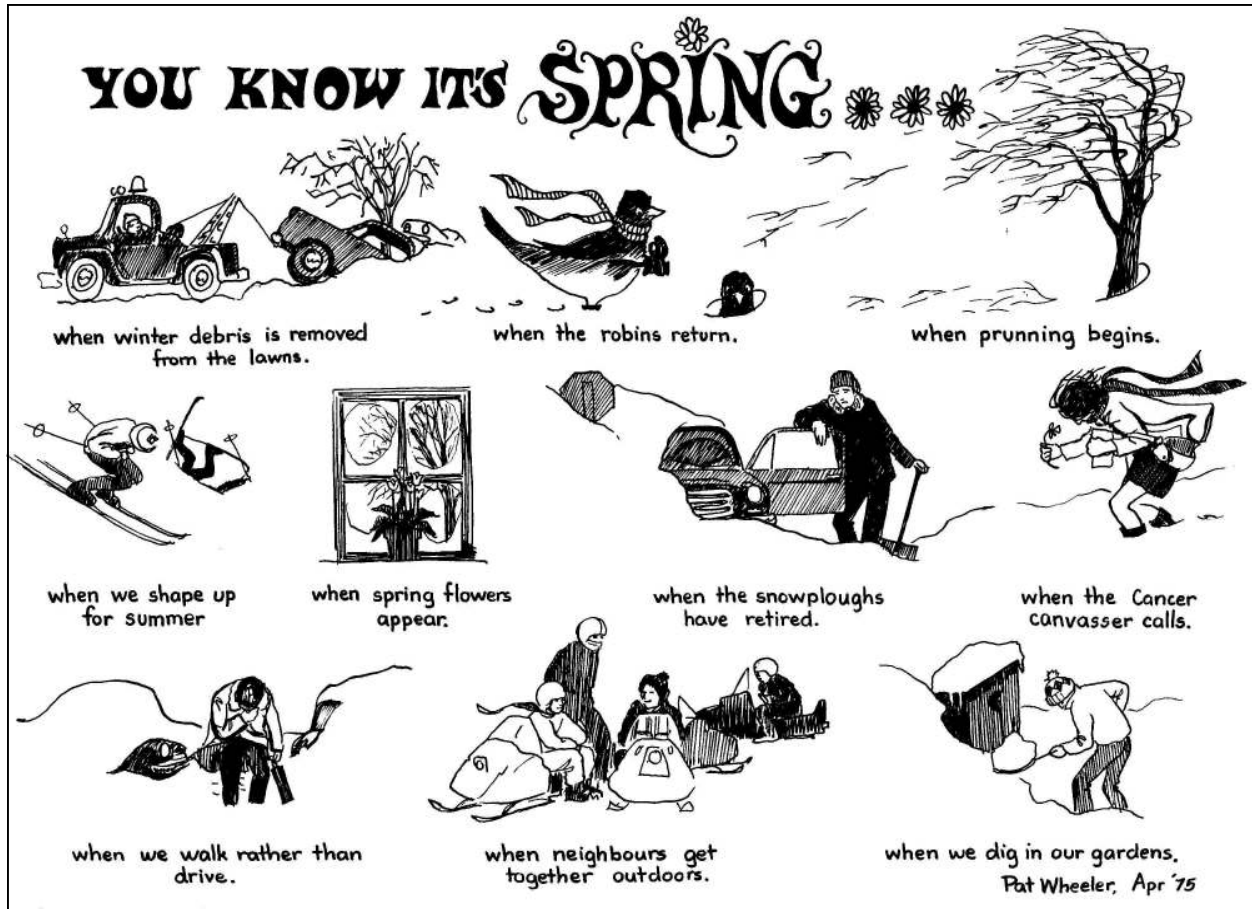
## DECEMBER HAT SALES

## **MISSION & SUPPORT GRANTS FOR 2011**

The Mission Support Consultation considered applications from 30 ministries and agencies last November. Funding cuts from M&S and Toronto United Church Council increase the challenge faced by the consultation.

Team members visit the applicants in advance of the group's review of the agencies applying for funds, which helps the consultation see the funding not as a charity but as mission work, which is a much larger commitment. Living Waters Presbytery received a total of \$98,200 for New Hope UC, Painswick UC, Interchurch Health Ministries, Georgina Island UC, and Muskoka Chaplaincy Association.

M&S supports a "day chaplains" program. These chaplains are able to give regular, ongoing support to palliative patients. They also provide an important support for hospital staff and a link for local clergy.
