## **Queen's Own Rifles of Canada Band to Perform in Concert at St. Andrew's**

On **Sunday, April 10 at 7pm**, the Queen's Own Rifles of Canada Band will return to St. Andrew's to perform in concert.

The Queen's Own Rifles of Canada Band is a brass and reed band of 35 musicians. The Band is quite diverse with the ability to perform in parades, concerts, graduations, ceremonies, dinners and dances. The repertoire for the band is also diverse, from the traditional military music to contemporary, from folk songs to R&B, Big Band to Light Rock, as well as from the Stage and Screen.



The Band is under the direction of **Capt. Rita P. Arendz, MMus, BMus, CD** as their Director of Music. Captain Arendz, began as a horn player with The Queen's Own Rifles in 1988, becoming the Band's Director of Music, in 1997 and has a Master of Music Wind Conducting degree from the University of Toronto's Faculty of Music.

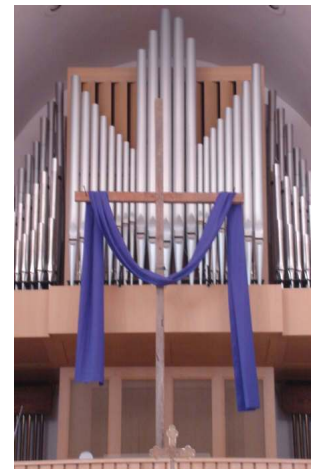

## **ST. ANDREW'S SETS A RECORD WITH 298 BEDKITS IN 2011**

**Sleeping Children Around the World (SCAW)** donations provide bedkits to children of any race and/or religion who will benefit the most; typically being located in underdeveloped and developing countries. No portion of a bedkit donation is spent on administration — 100% reaches a needy child. Each \$35 donation provides a bedkit that consists of a mat or mattress, pillow, sheet, blanket, mosquito net (if applicable), clothes outfit, towel and school supplies.

Every child is photographed with the bedkit, showing the donor's name/country (or special occasion message) on a label. Each photograph is then mailed back to the original donor, providing a timeless way for the donor to remember the child who so greatly benefitted from their generosity.



In 2010, through the hard work of the Outreach SCAW convenors, Marilyn and Russ Matheson, the generosity of the congregation, a pig roast and garage sales, \$10,440 were raised and 298 bedkits were purchased.....a remarkable achievement.

This month, the church begins its 19th year of involvement with SCAW and funds will be collected until April 30. The Outreach Committee is hoping that with your help they can set another record this year, providing a night of comfort and peaceful sleep for well over 300 children around the world.

## **GIVING TO THE MISSIONS & SERVICE FUND**

An article in April's Observer addresses the concerns people have that if they support local charities, they are hampering outreach to other countries. Barbara Fullerton of General Council has researched this and she says "What we have found is that when churches are outward focused then local givings don't suffer, but when they are inward focused they don't survive"

Fullerton also notes " While the number of people giving to the United Church M&S fund is decreasing, the amount that people are giving is going up". ## **CAMP BIG CANOE – Operation Bathtub 2011**

*"Operation Bathtub" is the new project for Camp Big Canoe this year.*

The response to the industrial strength dishwasher project of 2009 was so great, an amount of \$7000 was raised, that other organizations matched this donation and the machine is now in place.

The challenge for this year is to build an addition onto the nurse's cabin and put in place a much-needed bathtub, which will be used for medicinal purposes. **On April 3, envelopes will be available in the pews for your donation.** (tax receipt for over \$10 )



Of the four camps connected with Toronto Conference, Camp Big Canoe has been the camp where St. Andrew's children have spent their summers, some serving as CIT's and then becoming Councilors. Their parents were fundraisers and volunteers.

The UCW supports a camper each year and helps with the cookie drive and the wish list in June. At the February UCW Presbyterial meeting in Aurora, a collection of toonies and loonies netted \$310. Your participation and support in this program helps to ensure the continued success of Camp Big Canoe.

## **THE LEPROSY MISSION CANADA**

The UCW Presbyterial received a letter from The Leprosy Mission thanking them for their efforts in saving stamps. As of August 4, 2010, over \$5,385 has been raised. The goal is set at \$13,000 and when this is reached 37 leprosy patients will be able to receive cure and care.



Leprosy is caused by bacteria, which attacks the body's nervous system and can be cured by a Multi-Drug Therapy, which can take from six months to two years.

The stamps that you save are repackaged into bags and sold to stamp dealers. The money from the sales is used to supply medicine, care and rehabilitation to leprosy patients. If any albums or valuable stamp collections are received, they are sold through auctioneers.

And so, St. Andrew's, thank you for saving and trimming your stamps. Your gift helps restore dignity and courage to those in need.

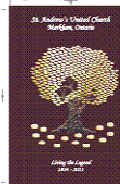

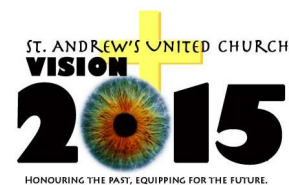
### **Committee Prepares Vision 2015 for April Service**

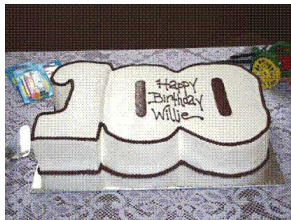
